Catholic Schools Week: Dividends for Life

3. *"During non-uniform days, I can wear anything"* – Wrong! There is a specific policy for non-uniform days.

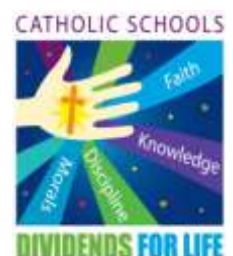
Please, review with your children the uniform policy that is in the student-parent handbook.

Más aclaraciones sobre el uniforme – Entonces, no lo cogen por sorpresa:

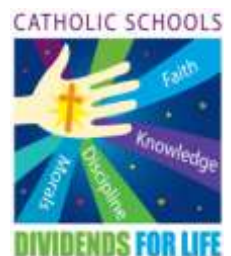
